Year of the Eucharist resources for adults

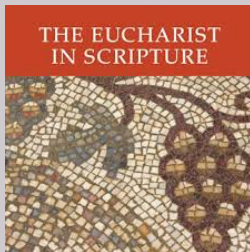


Eucharist (*Word on Fire, 2009; 77 minutes*) Bp. Robert Barron speaks before a live audience on three aspects of the Eucharist: as sacred

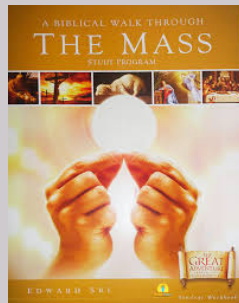
meal; as sacrifice; and as real presence.

The Eucharist in Scripture

(*Little Rock Scripture Study, 2014*) Emphasizes the importance of meals shared in faithful fellowship as part of a covenant relationship with God. Old Testament meals and promises



provide the foundation for Gospel meals with Jesus, culminating in the Last Supper as understood by Paul and in Matthew, Mark and Luke. "Breaking bread" in Acts and the Bread of Life discourse in John are carefully examined.



A Biblical Walk Through the Mass (*Five 30 minute sessions; Ascension Press, 2011*) In this study program Dr.

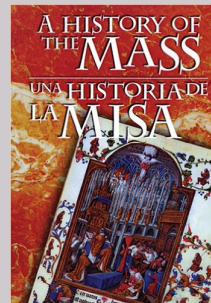
Edward Sri explores the Biblical roots of the words and gestures experienced at Mass and explains their significance.

Lectio: The Eucharist (*Ten 30 minute episodes; Augustine Institute, 2016*) Dr. Brant Pitre guides viewers through Scripture, history and Church

teaching to illuminate the wonder and miracle of the Eucharist.

historia de la Misa (*40 minutes; Liturgy Training Publications, 2001*) Traces the evolution of the Mass, showing how it was shaped

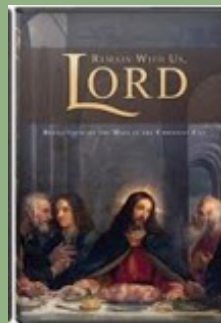
and reshaped by times and cultures, as well as developments in theology and the arts.

features a collection of personal stories and theological reflections on the importance of the Holy Mass in the spiritual life of a Catholic Christian.



Walk Through the Mass: Exploring the Sacred Liturgy (*22 minutes; Augustine Institute, 2014*) This episode from the Symbolon series about the Catholic Faith includes a segment that examines the significance of the rites and rituals that make up each part of the Mass.
